## TO GET STARTED, YOU WILL NEED:

Paper

Coloured paper or pencils

Scissors

Glue

A toilet paper roll













## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- **1& 2.** On white paper, draw the elephant's ears and trunk. Use the paper roll to measure.
- **3.** Cut out the ears and the trunk ask an adult to help you with this.
- **4.** Use coloured pencils, paint or glue squares of coloured paper to the paper roll, the ears and the trunk to decorate your patchwork elephant.
- **5.** Fold the trunk a couple of times. Glue the ears and the trunk to the roll and add the eyes. Your elephant is ready.
- 6. Your elephant is ready. Make more to create your own herd of elephants.
